What shapes do you see?

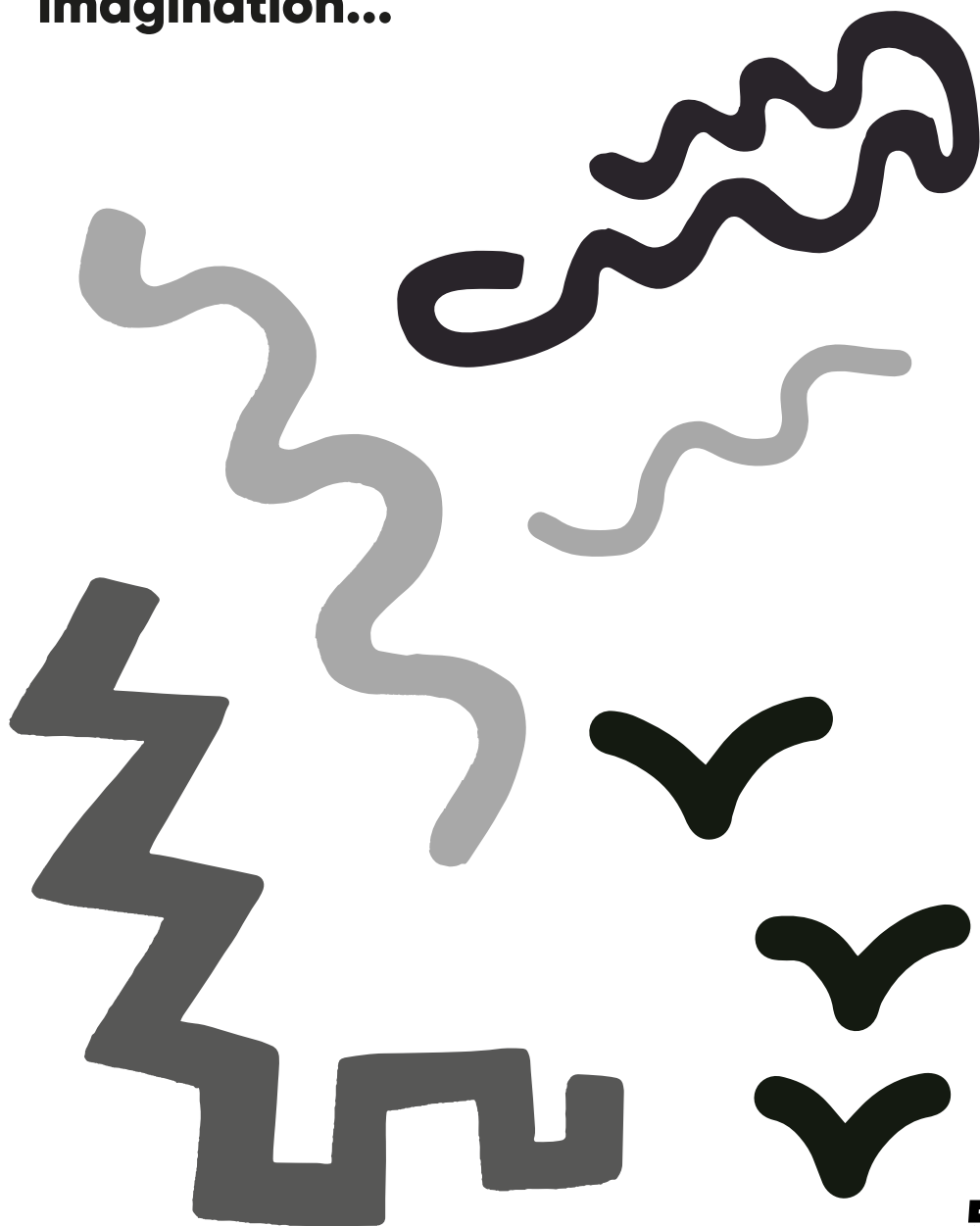


Draw some shapes that you can see whilst on your stroll here...

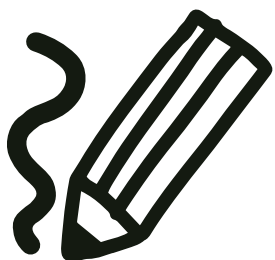


Drawing is making marks.

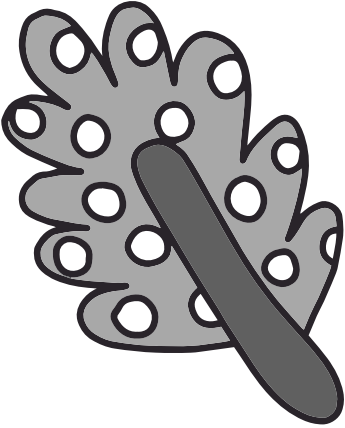
**Use your feelings, memory and

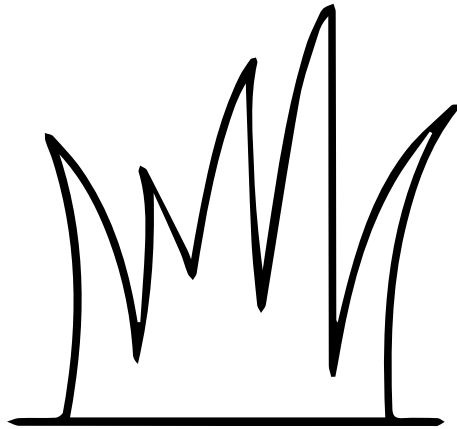
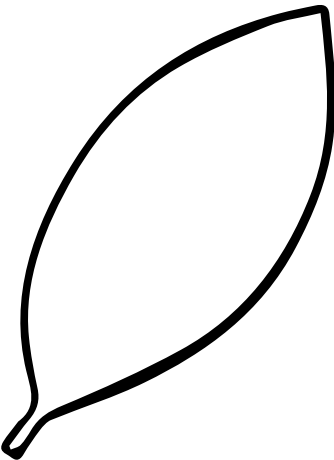


Just draw what you see!

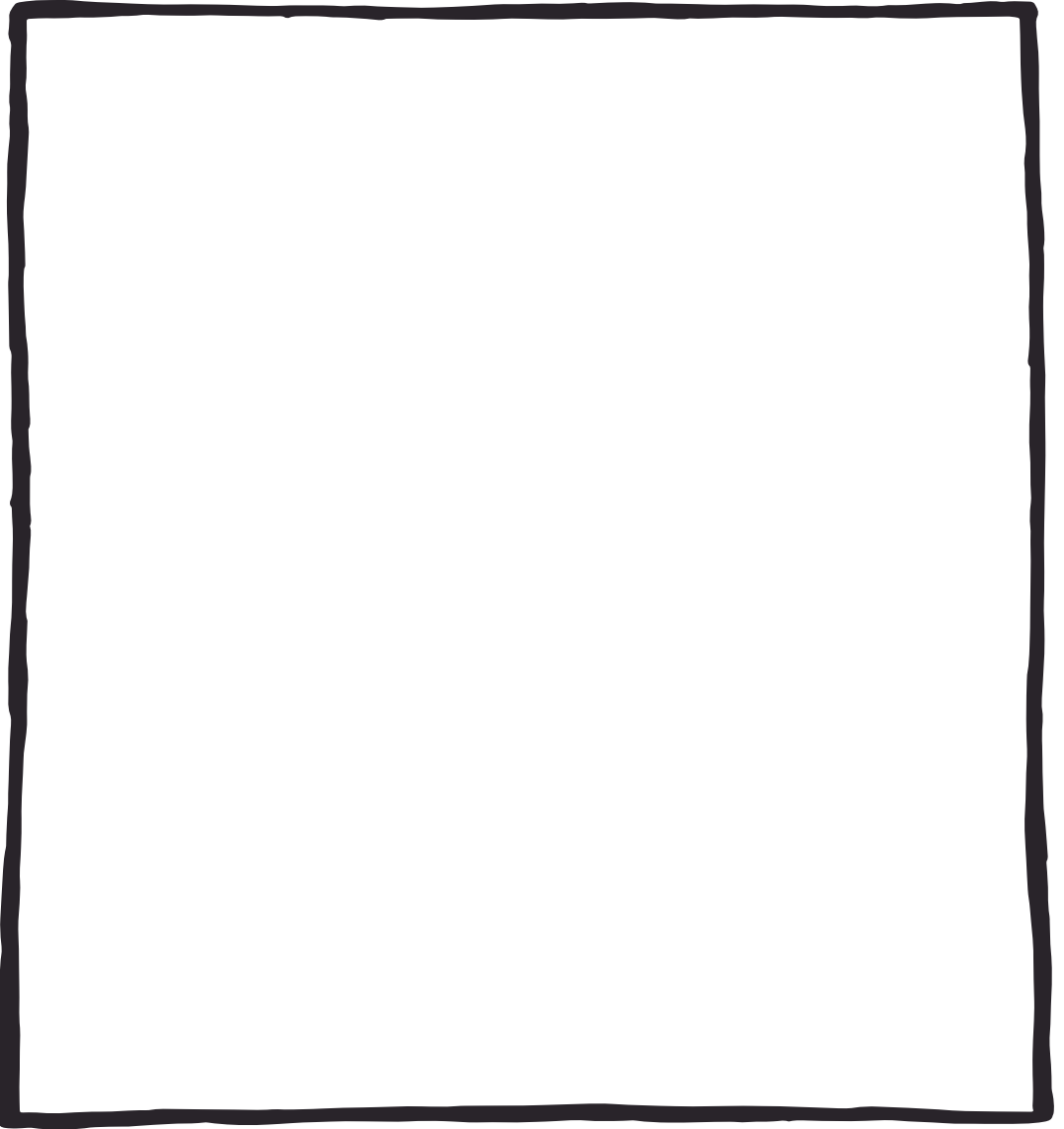


**Find a leaf, a piece of grass or a

Draw around it to make an outline.

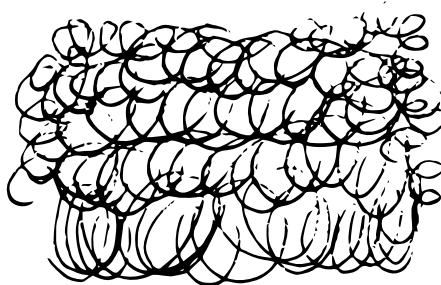
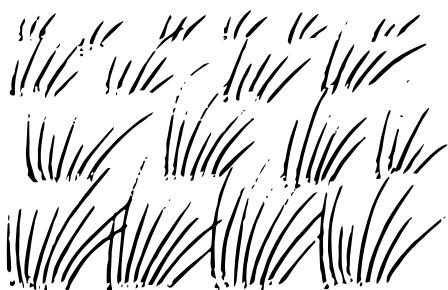
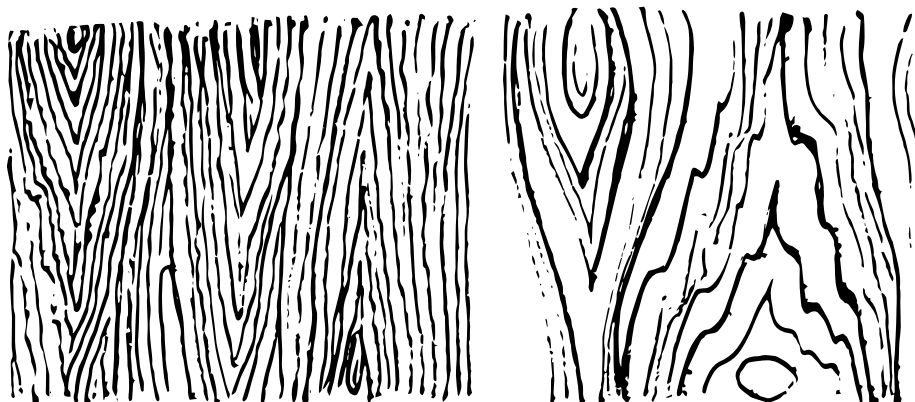


**Try drawing around your leaf or grass
lots of times to make a pattern...**



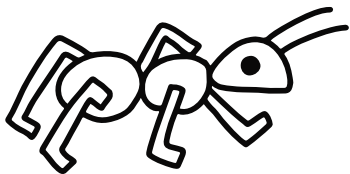
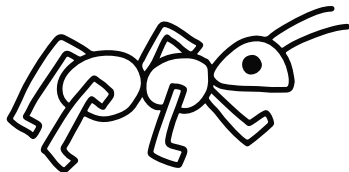
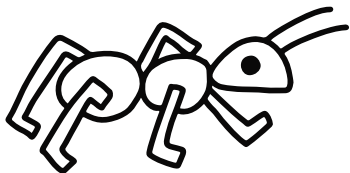

Drawing is using texture!



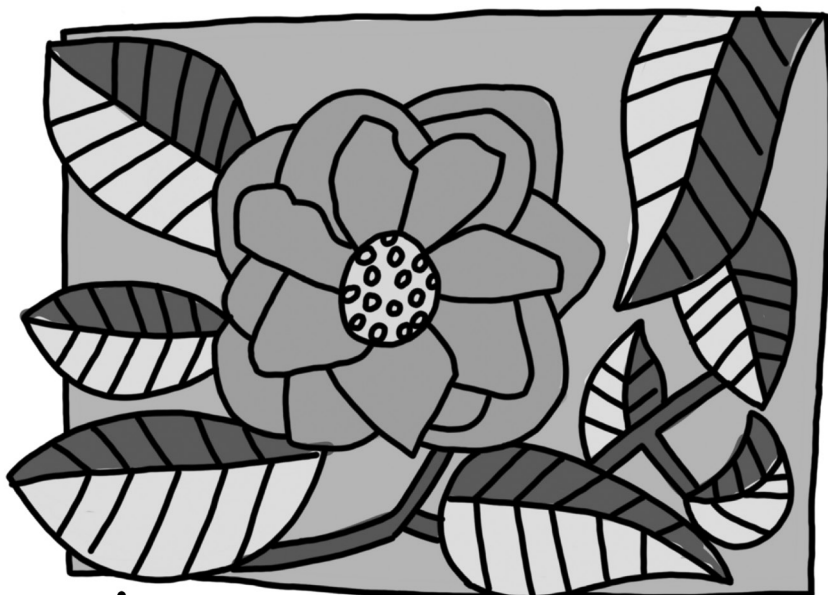
Use a crayon or pencil, and find a hard surface. Choose a leaf from the ground and place it onh your surface. Or find some bark on a tree to lean against. Place the paper on top and rub over it firmly using the side of your crayon or pencil. Watch the pattern appear!

Make a leaf or bark rubbing here to give your ants a home!



Draw the view!

Using a viewfinder helps you to focus on something and not get distracted by what's around it. It will help you pay close attention to the image that you are trying to create.



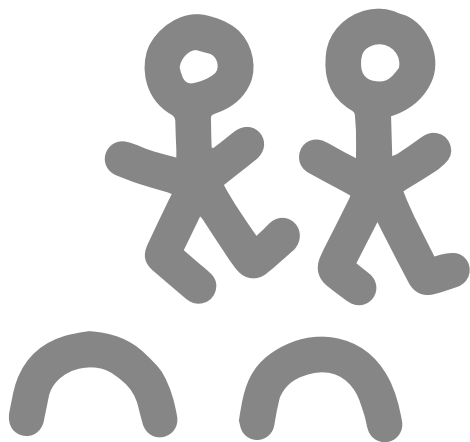
NICE FLOWER ON THE MOUNDS.

You could also take some photos of your favourite things you see on the mounds, for you to look at and draw when you get home!

1. Look carefully at your view or thing you are drawing.
2. Practice drawing different compositions.
3. Look for simple shapes that make up your image.
4. Just draw what you see!
5. Remember that your drawing doesn't have to look realistic.
6. You **CAN'T** do it wrong!

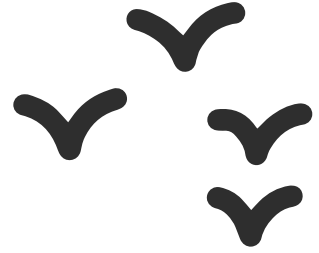

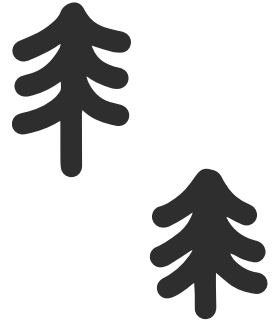

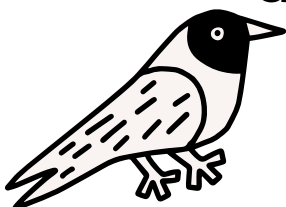
